How we use body parts such as the larynx to make the sounds we need to communicate.


Augmentative/Alternative Communication

- Private fee paying clients (self referred)

- Department of Veteran Affairs clients.

WHAT DOES IT LOOK LIKE?

Assessment

- Speech Pathology typically starts with assessment of the specific areas of concern that have led a client to seek our services. For example, we might assess someone's receptive and expressive language (what they understand and what they say), or which sounds they are using when they are talking.
- Where possible, we take into account information from other practitioners, family members or educators.

Goal setting & intervention planning

 We then collaboratively develop goals and an intervention plan, which sometimes includes personalised resources (eg. flashcards).

Intervention

 The Speech Pathologist then leads the intervention (primarily in-clinic), complemented by home practice and other strategies.
